**About the Wine** – Kiona’s Cabernet Sauvignon is crafted in the Bordeaux-style from some of Washington’s finest vineyards. 28 months of oak aging and a splash of Merlot and Cabernet Franc give this wine plenty of character. Free-run juice and significant bottle aging contribute to this wine’s exceptionally smooth tannin profile.

**Tasting Notes** – This multifaceted, raffish Cabernet, though not all from the estate vineyard, has Red Mountain’s signature structure, nicely balanced by aromas and flavors of cassis, violets, plum, and smoke.
